The community lacks potable and safe water since separation from the bigger community of Lanniyiri 27 years ago. They are denied water from the nearby communities when they go there to beg. The only source of water available to them is the stream but it dries up during the dry season while the other option is dug-out (situated in Balawa) which is 3.5 kilometers from the community which they only go every morning as its very far, this made the kids not to bath while the adult just 2-3 times a week.

The community is made up of mainly Birifors and has 24 households. The inhabitants are estimated about 309 (Annex A-Community Profile attached)

The community was referred to SAC through the Assesmblyman who happens to be know one of SAC staff.

A visit was conducted to crosschecked the situation and we took photos hoping to lobby for any donors who wants to support communities with water.

Ghana Outlook-UK, SAC major donor in water and sanitation projects just completed a borehole for a community/school and now is looking for another needy community to turn over the aqua-filter box, Sor-Ereteng fits the bill and accepted the aqua-filter box.

SAC has monitored its usage until the good news was delivered to them after nine good months.

Layer of mud rock started coming, at 53 meters water was hit. Continued drilling up to 60 meters. 12:31 pm drilling stopped. Water coming out at 90 liters per minute (Annex C-sketch)

Dirty water was sucked-out and water sample was taken for testing. Pipe has been sealed.

Water test (Annex D) came back and the Ghana Water Company Laboratory in the Upper West Region said that the water sample submitted has met its physico-chemical standards and microbiological standards and therefore recommend for domestic use.

In response to the water project, Angturo, the 70 years old woman who cried to SAC staff during one visit monitoring on the Aqua-Filter said that they used to struggle a lot and having the borehole right in front of them is the biggest gift they got in their life. She asked God to protect the people that donated the money to fund the water. The stress they used to have when looking for water has now paid off. For Sung-ara, a 60 years old woman who doubted about the project as she kept on hearing for meeting and yet no water is coming, she can only say she has doubted no more. God has performed miracle to them.
